This project involved the equipping of a large number of observation rooms to enable the televising of individual and group therapy sessions

Each therapy room was furnished with a comfortable seating area for patients and equipped with remotely controllable Pan Zoom and Tilt (PZT) dome cameras and ceiling mounted microphones to provide high quality video and audio feeds

Behind each, and separated by one way mirrored glass, was a control area for Observers with audio and video recording equipment

From here, two or three cameras were manipulated by joystick operation, and both the video and audio transmissions recorded to include picture in picture (PiP) of any two cameras operating simultaneously.

The session could also be viewed either through the one way mirror or on a large colour monitor

In ear intercom and induction loop technology was also installed to provide push-to-talk communications between the Observers and one or more of the participants in the adjacent therapy room
